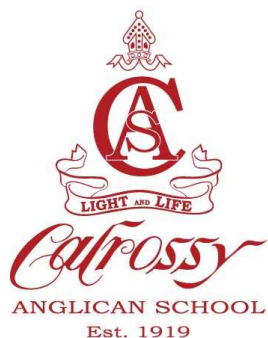

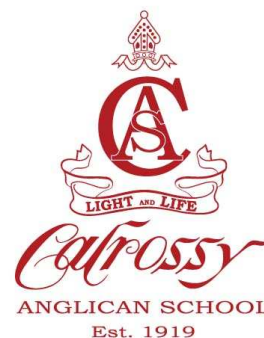

## **Car Park Safety**

One issue that remains a priority for the safety of our children is following the rules for safe use of the Kiss and Drop Lane of a morning and afternoon. Please follow the guidelines carefully.

Parents and students need to be familiar with the arrangements for the use of our car park. Unless everyone complies with the arrangements we will not be able to provide the safest possible pick up and drop off facilities for our children. **Please be sure to inform those people who deliver and collect your children to and from school of these guidelines.**

## **Traffic Flow**

- traffic must flow in one direction only through the car park.
- entry is via the gate closest to Moore Creek and the exit is via the gate closest to Town.

## **Kiss and Drop Lane**

***Under no circumstances are cars permitted to hold up the flow of traffic through this lane.***

- **this lane is strictly for drive through only.**
- Traffic in this lane must be kept to one lane only. This is to enable safe entry into vehicles where it is not possible for a child to get in from the kerb.
- At no time should parents park and leave their car during the afternoon peak period.
- Students will only be allowed to get into cars at the end of the lane, thus ensuring that cars keep moving through the lane, and stop only at the end long enough for their child to get into the car.
- **If your child is not at the pick up point when your car arrives there, you will need to drive out onto Moore Creek Road and re enter the Kiss and Drop Lane.**

## **Bus Lane**

- **Please do not drive through or park in this lane during the morning or afternoon peak periods which are 8.20am-8.45am and 2.45pm-3.40pm.**
- You may drive through the bus lane at any other time, and may park in it during the school day if you are visiting and there are no spaces available in the car park.

## **Parking**

- **Please park with the rear of your car in to the kerb.**  
We ask that you do this so that you are able to see clearly when leaving your space.
- Please do not park in the disabled spaces unless you are entitled to do so.
- Overflow parking is available on the grass area adjacent to the car park and is accessed by turning left as you enter the car park.

When dropping children at school of a morning, please drive to the end of the Kiss and Drop Lane and have children walk back to the crossing. Please remember that this is not a parking area in the busy time before and after school. If you need to park, please do so in either of the carparks.

**Please note that the area outside the Office should be kept clear for emergency vehicles at all times. Thank you in advance for your understanding and cooperation in the use of our car park.**

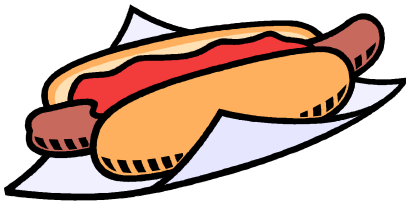

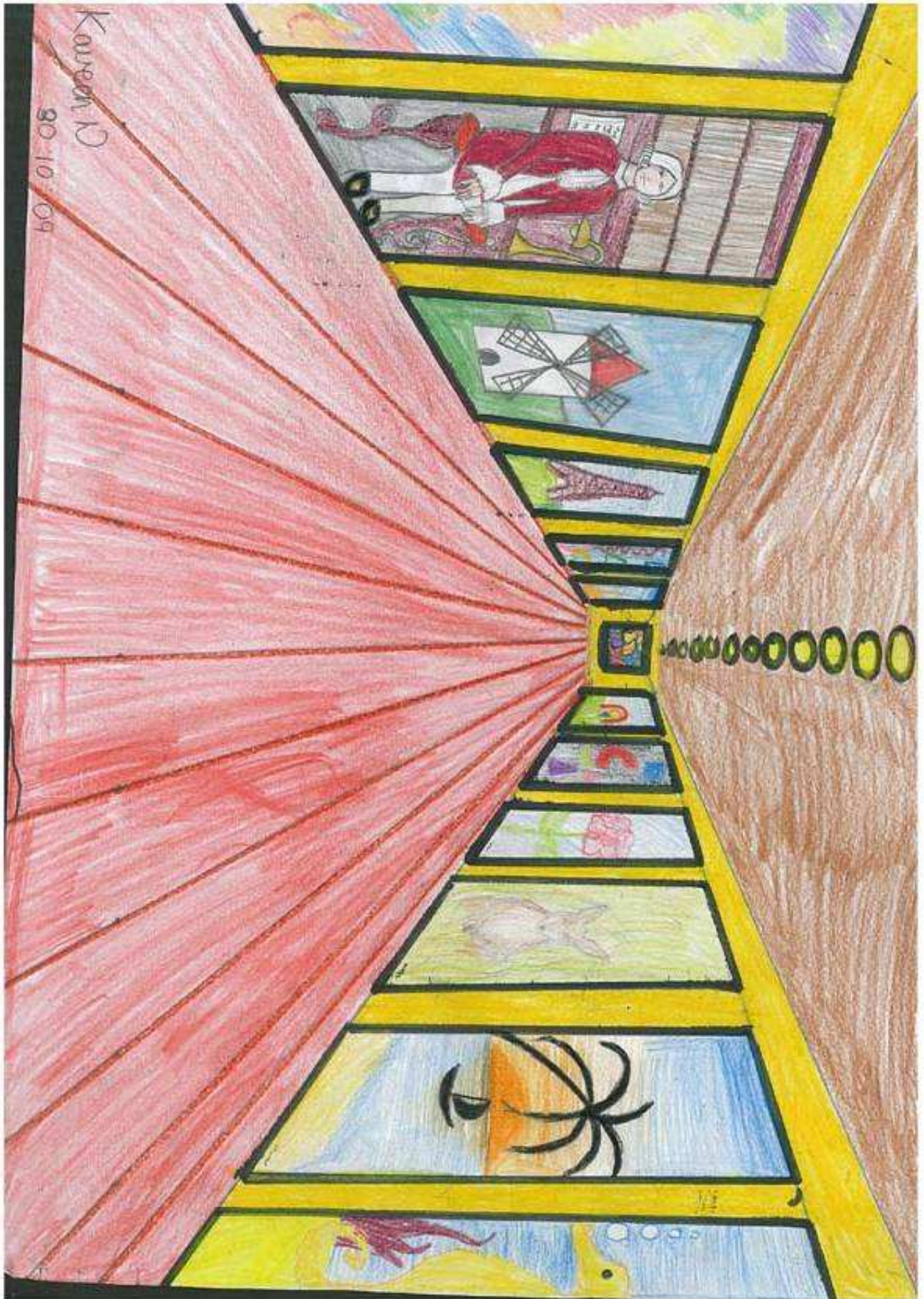

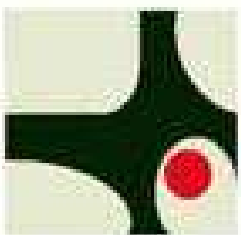
